DATE: 26-06-2020


TOPIC: "UNEMPLOYMENT PROBLEM IN INDIA"

TOPIC: "ENSURING EQUALITY IN THE EDUCATION OF SC & ST"


THEME:


TOPIC: - "Romanticism Vs. Classicism"

THEME:



TOPIC: "Anemia in women of reproductive age"


THEME:

EVENT DESCRIPTION:


The webinar was organized virtually by Home Science Department on 12.02.2021 at 11 AM. The webinar was inaugurated by Mrs


TOPIC: "Responsibilities of Parenting"


THEME:





TOPIC:ROLE OF CONSTITUENT ASSEMBLY IN PREPARING "THE CONSTITUTION OF INDIA"


THEME:


TOPIC:"PROTECTION OF RIGHTS OF WOMEN"


TOPIC: "POLITICS AND EMPOWERMENT OF INDIAN WOMEN"

THEME:


